# **Near Neighbours**

I'm Viv Froggatt and I'd like to introduce myself as the new Near Neighbours coordinator for Leicester. Some of you may remember the lovely Beth Henwood and before that, the wonderful and much missed John McCallum. So, I'm now taking on the role that they inhabited so brilliantly before me. I live in the Humberstone area of Leicester where I'm an Associate Minister at St Mary's & St Barnabas Church and Christchurch Thurnby Lodge. I'm also involved with school governance at the local academy trust and the wider Diocesan academy trust. #### What is Near Neighbours?

Near Neighbours is focused on bringing together people in diverse communities, to create relationships of trust and to help people transform their local neighbourhoods. I'm particularly involved in helping groups apply for small grants towards projects which:

- bring together people of two or more different faiths and/or ethnicities to build friendships and build relationships of trust
- work locally to enable people from the same street, estate or neighbourhood to come together
- work sustainably to nurture long term and natural relationships that will last beyond the period of funding work to improve the community and make it a better place to live
- involve people from more than one faith group or ethnicity in planning the project and making it happen.

This year we're particularly focusing on:

- integrating refugees and migrants
- supporting vulnerable women
- supporting young people
- engaging with isolated and hard to reach communities and groups

The grants can range from £250 - £4,000. I can supply you with the criteria booklet or you can find it on <a href="https://www.near-neighbours.org.uk/small-grants">https://www.near-neighbours.org.uk/small-grants</a>. The projects need to complete by March 31<sup>st</sup> 2023.

I'll be very happy to meet up with you for an informal chat and help in any way I can. If you are interested in taking an application forward, then you need to bear in mind that the application window is currently due to end by **9**<sup>th</sup> **December 2022**. This may change depending on demand.

During Autumn 2022 the Home Office have published a new package of Prevent training resources that can be completed online. The courses are focused towards learning about the Prevent Statutory Duty and how this can be adopted into relevant sector work.

The training is primarily directed towards staff who deliver the Prevent Statutory Duty so these would include education, health, local authorities, police, prisons, probation, and youth justice. However, staff working in other sectors may also find the training beneficial.

Consent Expo. Thanks to Sgt Jen and PC Rachel for joining us.




## **Religion & Belief Training for new Police Recruits**
