Work with Churches

Places of Welcome



St Philip's Centre were delighted earlier in the year to work with Near Neighbours to 🐧 support the opening of five new Places of Welcome and help them apply for grant funding. We were pleased that all of the projects in Leicester who applied for funding received it. The national Places of Welcome team have visited two of the projects- the Belgrave Neighbourhood Tenants Co-operative and the Place of Welcome at Elim Church, Narborough Road and were pleased to see the work that has happened there.

All of the Places of Welcome are doing valuable work in the communities. Leicester Unitarians have developed a relationship with a local carers' group for people with disabilities through their Place of

Welcome which has resulted in the group now having use of part of the church garden as outdoor space.

Communities of Christ (The Little Blue Church) on Abbey Lane regularly host local Police Surgeries and other advice services. Their Place of Welcome now has a number of regular attenders and there are a number of activities on offer for those who attend. This is making a positive impact in the community around them and the Wednesday Place of Welcome is becoming known in the local community.

Birstall Mothers' Union
